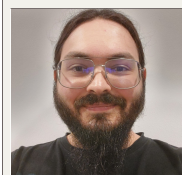
MEET THE PROJECT TEAM



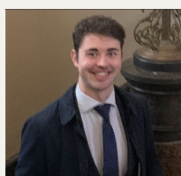
Grace Emely

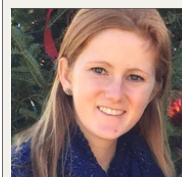

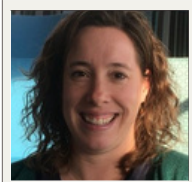

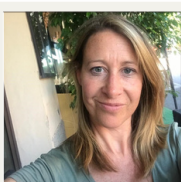
Meetal Gupta

INTRODUCTION: YOUNG PROFESSIONALS IN THE HERITAGE SECTOR

During our first meeting, we will announce some practicalities, followed by an introduction of the upcoming sessions and thematic approaches. The members of the project team who have organised the event will introduce themselves.

After these first introductions, we will split up into smaller groups with a few guiding questions. We will dive into the work experiences of our participants - young people working, studying or volunteering in the field of heritage.

MASTERCLASS: CLIMATE HERITAGE & DIGITAL ADVOCACY

The masterclass is organised in collaboration with Europa Nostra, The Climate Heritage Network, and the Climate Heritage Network Youth Forum. The European Masterclass for cultural heritage will focus on teaching and developing skills for advocacy communication.

An example from a previous advocacy campaign by the Climate Heritage Network will be presented and participants will have the opportunity to provide input to an ongoing advocacy document for youth in the heritage sector that ESACH is preparing.

During the masterclass, ESACH, The Future is Heritage, and Europa Nostra will present the first results of the **policy paper survey**. We will reflect on the conclusions so far.

SESSION: CONTESTED HERITAGE

In this session, the transatlantic slave trade, as well as the material culture produced by and about enslaved Africans in Dutch Brazil is used as a case study to stimulate discussion around the contested (and too often overlooked) colonial heritage of museums in the contemporaneity. The main question: How does African slavery and colonial heritage reflect upon today's museum practices? The participants will be invited to rename and create new descriptions / tags to artworks and artifacts reinterpreting / adding meaningful information regarding their colonial history, which is often overlooked by the institutions those are housed at.



Speaker: Carolina Monteiro

Carolina Monteiro is a PhD candidate at Leiden University as part of the ERC Project BRASILIAE. Her research focuses on the knowledge, cultural practices and social role of enslaved Africans from different points of origin and cultural backgrounds in the period of Dutch Brazil (1630-1654), beyond their captivity status. Carolina has worked as a researcher for the exhibition "Shifting Image: In Search of Johan Maurits" at the Mauritshuis and her professional career also includes practical experiences in art institutions in Brazil and Spain"

SESSION: HERITAGE & CONFLICT

The protection of cultural heritage has always been of critical importance to communities around the world. Yet, armed conflicts and wanton destructions are one of the many threats cultural heritage is facing, that are man-made. In the face of war in Europe and around the world, how can we better protect cultural heritage in the event of armed conflicts and safeguard it for future generations? This workshop will give insight into the threats heritage faces in times of conflict and what measures can be taken before, during and after a conflict.

Speaker: Elisabeth Korinth

Elisabeth Korinth is Vice President of the German National Committee of the Blue Shield e.V. and UNESCO World Heritage Officer at the Senate Department for Culture and Europe Berlin. In her role as Vice-President, she manages the ad-hoc working group for monitoring damages and war losses of built heritage in Ukraine.

Speaker: Anastasiia Putilina

Anastasiia Putilina has an academic and professional background in linguistics and heritage studies. As a heritage practitioner and an engaged Ukrainian citizen, she would like to use this opportunity to present current threats for the heritage sector of Ukraine and to work together with you on ideas about what could be done to help it.

SESSION: HERITAGE & INCLUSIVITY

Heritage plays an increasingly important role in the development of the contemporary city. The workshop 'Future perspectives of Prague's historic features' offers an explorative investigation of how and where heritage can accommodate societal needs. And vice versa: it offers an explorative investigation of new impulses that can provide a future base of existence to Prague's heritage. During the workshop, the group will be divided in six subgroups: each subgroup acts as one specific stakeholder group.

Speaker: Jean Paul Corten.

Jean-Paul Corten obtained his degree in history at Utrecht University, after which he studied planning. He started his career as a researcher in the history of technology at Eindhoven University. Currently he is employed as senior policy officer on Integrated Conservation at the Cultural Heritage Agency of the Netherlands. He is also affiliated with the Institute for Housing and Urban Development Studies, Erasmus University of Rotterdam. He is involved in many urban regeneration projects abroad.



SESSION: HERITAGE & PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Bert Ludwig and Marija Konjević will give an introduction to European Heritage Volunteers and share their experiences with the programme. How do European Heritage Training Courses and European Heritage Volunteers Projects open doors for emerging heritage professionals and enthusiasts to make meaningful experiences and contributions? The participants will be split into groups and asked to brainstorm about potential project ideas consisting of site and topic.

Speaker: Bert Ludwig

Dr. Bert Ludwig, born in Germany, studied architecture and heritage studies in Germany and Czech Republic. After his studies he worked at heritage administrations on local, regional and federal state levels. Later he moved to the non-profit sector and worked at various non-governmental organisations in the fields of cultural heritage, intercultural education and civil society engagement in Germany and on European level.



Since several years he is the director of European Heritage Volunteers. In this position he has been involved in the development and the implementation of the European Heritage Volunteers Programme which offers all over Europe training courses, volunteering projects, and other formats of non-formal education for young heritage professionals and young heritage-dedicated amateurs in the fields of heritage conservation, traditional handicrafts and awareness raising for cultural heritage.

Speaker: Marija Konjević

Marija Konjević holds a BA in Tourism from the Faculty of Tourism and Hotel Management in Kotor (University of Montenegro) and an MA in World Heritage Studies from the Brandenburg University of Technology in Cottbus, Germany. Her most recent working experience is coordinating projects and training courses within European Heritage Volunteers Programme, providing student assistance and tutoring for Tourism and Cultural Management modules at BTU as well as diving into cultural policy research.

Theresienstadt housed over 144,000 Jewish inmates during the Nazi regime and was partly used as a waystation to extermination camps. During the excursion, we will receive a guided tour (in English) through the Small Fortress and we will be able to visit the Ghetto Museum on our own.

We will be back in Prague around 18:00 PM.

THE EUROPEAN HERITAGE POLICY AGORA CONCLUSIONS TO THE FUTURE IS HERITAGE SUMMIT 2022

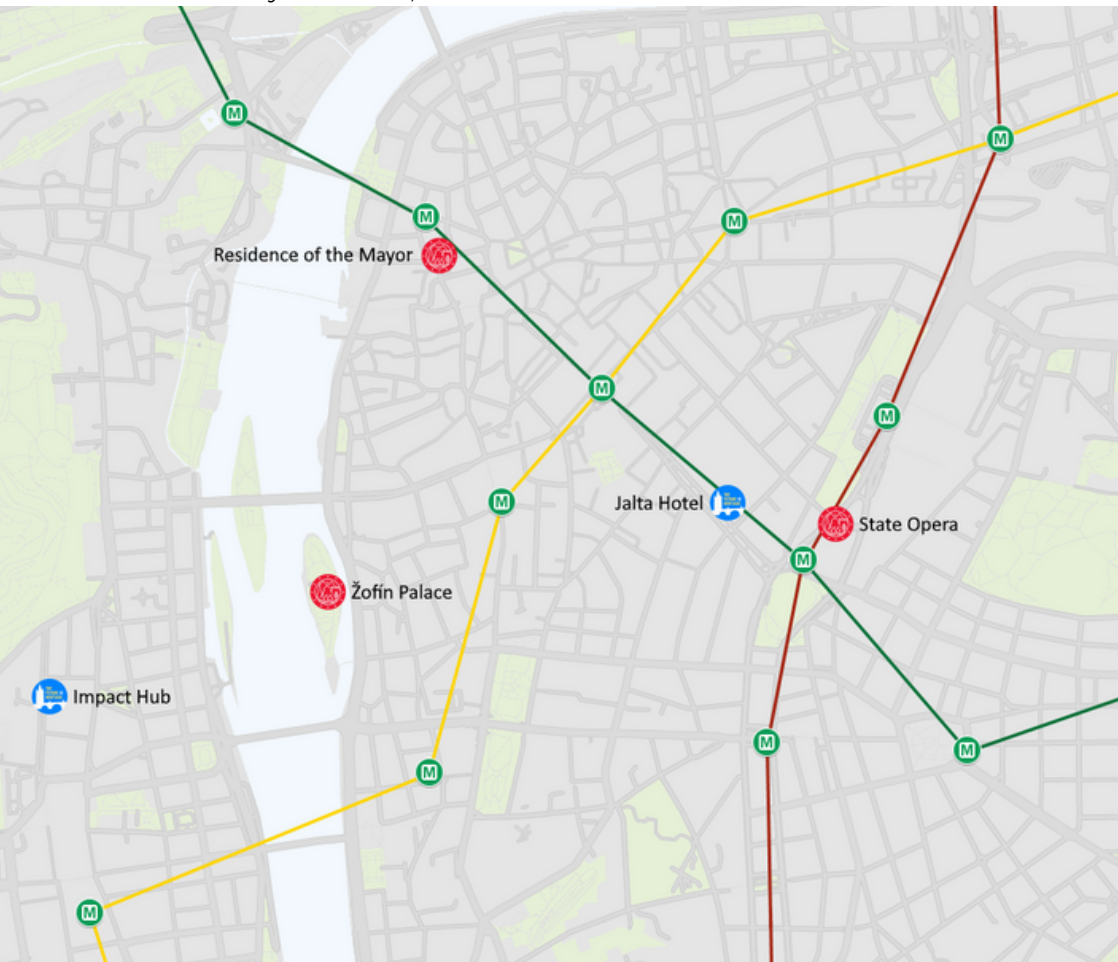
